

FAI-RENCAP International Academy offers integration scholarships for its "Humanitarian Corps" program

The AMAN-International Foundation (FAI) has opened an online training for its 'FAI Humanitarian Corps Capacity Building' program

Berlin (17.10. 2011) - The Board of Directors of the AMAN-International Foundation (FAI), based in Germany, informs our readers of the official opening of a special department of its institution: The FAI-RENCAP International Academy with a distance learning unit for its 'Capacity Building' program (FAI-RENCAP) which is in charge of piloting and delivering one of FAI's most important programs called 'FAI Humanitarian Corps' through which the Foundation intends to orient and integrate the young and not so young, especially in countries in difficulty, in order to better succeed in the challenge of poverty reduction.

The Director of the Board of Directors of AMAN-International Foundation, Professor Dr. h. c. Bernd-Dieter FRIDRICH, invites all and especially civil society organizations to visit the renovated website of AMAN-International Foundation (www.aman-international.org) or to visit the special website of the FAI-RENCAP International Academy (www.aman-international.org/rencap).

In a special message, Professor FRIDRICH recalled the Roman philosopher and politician Lucius Annaeus Seneca and his cherished maxim: "Non scholae, sed vitae discimus", which means: "We do not learn for school, but for life" - chosen by the AMAN-International Foundation Board of Directors as the slogan of the FAI-RENCAP International Academy.

The Director of the FAI Board of Directors emphasized that in poor and developing countries, this maxim is even more true since many people do not have the opportunity to go to school, to pursue long studies or at least to benefit from a job after studies. Therefore, he explained, the FAI-RENCAP program set up in 2007 by FAI and entrusted to the steering of the Board of Directors in Germany has been working not only to understand the needs, expectations and aspirations of the young and not so young in countries in difficulty, but also to train them for these years as well as to show the way to personal and social development by producing means of support for the targets.

The Director of the FAI Board of Directors demonstrated that, based on observations, surveys and experiences carried out by his institution, there is a great positive dynamic among young people, especially from countries in difficulty. In a vision of restoration and development involving young and old, the FAI-RENCAP program has already trained and reintegrated several hundred people. During the past years, activities related to this program have been carried out in Côte d'Ivoire for beneficiaries arriving from all over the country, but also from several countries of Black Africa to participate in this special program.

The FAI-RENCAP International Academy is now open to the general public with a distance learning unit that will allow everyone, regardless of their geographical location, to benefit from the exclusive "FAI Humanitarian Corps" program. This program aims at synchronizing the organization of field

operations that will see the participation of FAI Humanitarian Corps from different socio-cultural backgrounds or geographical areas for the conduct of joint operations in favor of needy targets (disaster, war, etc.). To this end, the Humanitarian Corps will be prepared by the vast program of aid for the reconstruction of the Ivory Coast. Professor FRIDRICH emphasized that the Humanitarian Corps will be able to participate in the life of a unique community, share experiences and benefit from the opportunities associated with this program such as academic scholarships among others.

The Director of the Board of Directors indicated that the new program of this International Academy is a real aid package that brings great innovations. In addition to the special training programs that it will always offer on the basis of support scholarships, sanctioned as usual by the certifications of the FAI Board of Directors in Germany, he announced that the innovation lay in the various support programs associated with high performance and impact on poverty reduction, offered by the AMAN-International Foundation (Telephone: +225 / 22 - 41 53 38 | +225 / 07- 53 35 45).

Indeed, the FAI-RENCAP International Academy is positioned as a real tool for the mobilization of a vast network of actors who are highly aware of and involved in humanitarian and development issues and their priorities. For the program participants themselves, the FAI-CAP provides a program for the redistribution of income to enable them to carry out individual or collective projects.
